Intended as a posed-up photo of his mother "spanking" auto dealer A.D. Penner, this picture turned out to have more historic significance than was originally intended. The bulldozer seen in the background is in the act of demolishing the last remaining house-barn combination which was built as part of the original village of Steinbach, to make way for a car-storage lot. The destruction of the buildings helped shock local preservationists into taking the action that led to the establishment of Steinbach's \$4 million Mennonite Heritage Museum.

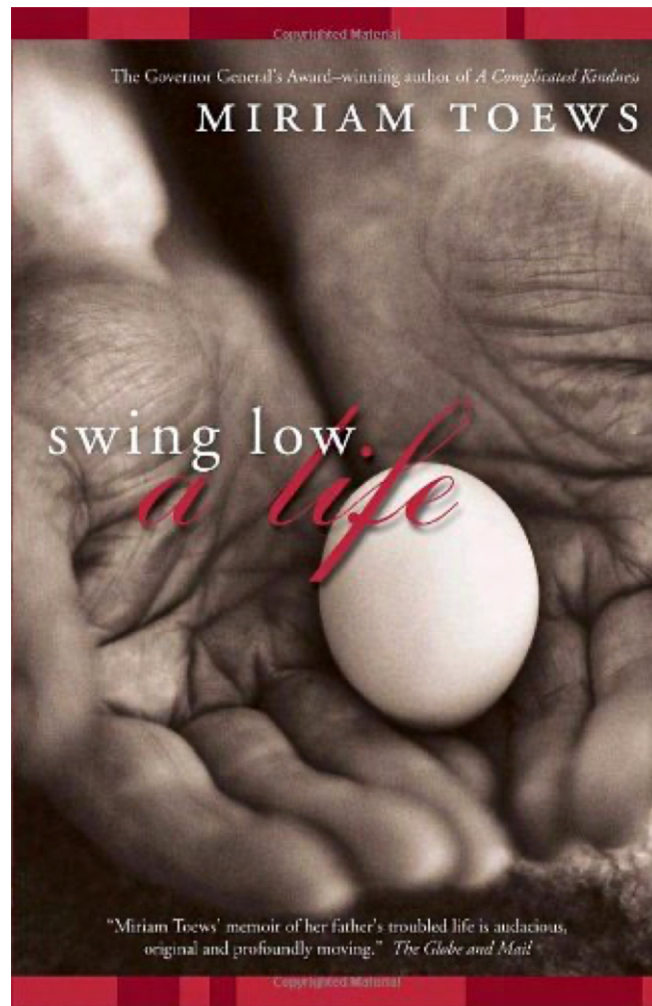

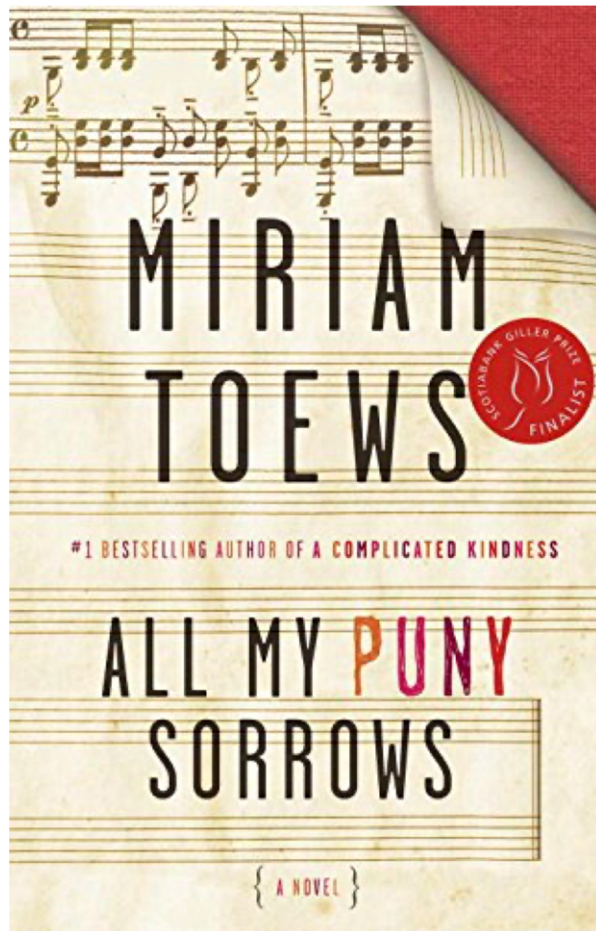

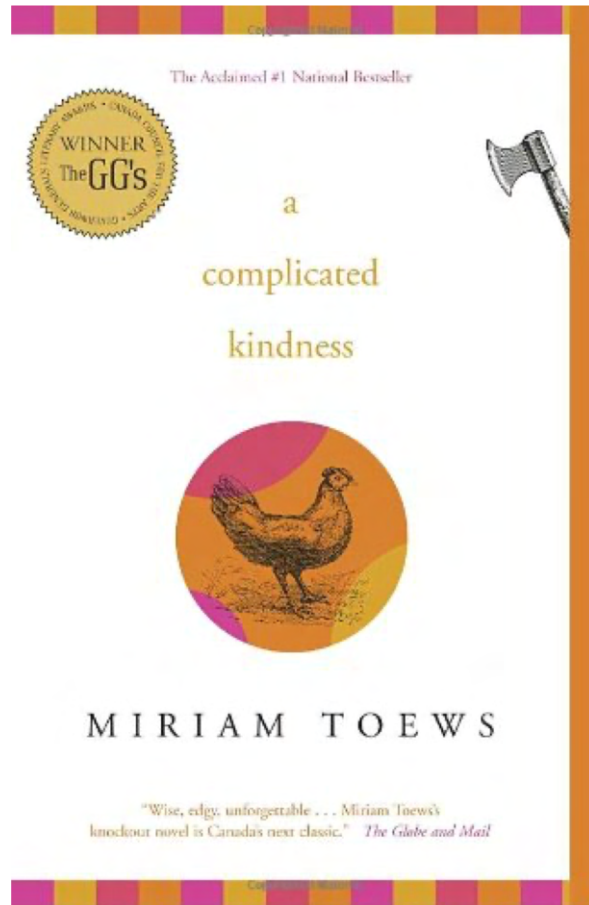
